ZONE 1 MEET BOARD CANDIDATE RICHARD PETREE



Richard Petree is a native of Abilene, a lifetime resident of Taylor County and a Taylor Electric Cooperative member of 40-plus years. He attended Abilene public schools, graduated from Cooper High School and remained in Abilene to complete his undergraduate studies at McMurry University. His degrees include a Bachelor of Business Administration in economics and general business and a bachelor's in secondary education with teaching specialties in economics and history.

Petree is married to Cammie, an instructor and head volleyball coach at McMurry University. Petree is the father of six children: Angela, a teacher in Lubbock; Shawn, a minister in Seattle; Jason, a building contractor in North Carolina; Chance, a commercial sales representative; Megan, a teacher at Wylie Inde-

pendent School District; and Austin, a junior at Abilene Christian University. The Petrees have 12 grandchildren. Petree lives in rural Taylor County and is a steward to his family and their land, enjoying his farm crops and hunting with his son.

Petree is a licensed bivocational Methodist minister and recently retired from Nolan United and Pioneer Memorial Methodist churches. He served as the community spiritual director and a board member of Big Country Emmaus and as spiritual director of Cross Country Emmaus and Sweetwater Emmaus, local divisions of the worldwide nondenominational church organization. He has been a member of the boards of Rotary International, the Kiwanis Club of Abilene, United Way of Abilene, Sears Methodist Retirement Systems Inc., and Butman Methodist Camp and Retreat Center. He was also an executive board member of and fund secretary for the Texas Political Subdivisions Joint Self-Insurance Fund.

Petree began his career at West Texas Utilities in 1970 in industrial development; he departed in 1976 when he was elected to the position of county tax assessor-collector. He served two terms as the Taylor County assessor, then was named the first chief appraiser of Taylor County during his last term. With the exception of a nine-month stint as chief appraiser for Travis County in 1988, Petree remained the chief appraiser of Taylor County until his retirement in 2013 for a total of 37 years with the county.

Petree is a licensed facilitator for FranklinCovey and teaches 7 *Habits of Highly Effective People* and *Leadership: Great Leaders, Great Teams, Great Results* to government employees. He has been a member of the International Association of Assessing Officers since 1981, was elected to the executive board of IAAO in 2004 and has served on various committees of IAAO including nominations, awards and education. In 2010, he was named Member of the Year for IAAO. He has also been a member of the Texas Association of Assessing Officers since 1977 and a member of the Texas Association of Appraisal Districts since 1982, where he has served in all office positions. TAAD has recognized him twice: with the Earl Luna Award in 1988 for outstanding chief appraiser and in 2004 with the James Goodwin Excellence in Education award. He's also a certified instructor for the state of Texas, teaching courses in appraisal and ethics.

Petree now serves as a consultant to 40 appraisal districts and, along with his staff of 19, has provided complete appraisal services to most of those districts, including appraisals of rural land for market value and agricultural use value. He has developed numerous schedules for land values and improvement values of housing, farm buildings and commercial buildings, utilizing all three approaches to value as the basis for those schedules. His company is called Western Valuation and Consulting and can be found at westernvc.com.

Petree has actively served on the Taylor Electric Cooperative Board of Directors since September 2014. He promptly earned his National Rural Electric Cooperative Association Credentialed Cooperative Director certificate, followed by the NRECA Board Leadership certificate, and he received the association's Director Gold credential in 2021.



Taylor Electric is grateful for the time, dedication and careful consideration given by the members on the nominating committee.




The Power Behind Your Power

You've likely noticed Taylor Electric Cooperative's crews working on power lines and other electrical equipment in our community. It's no secret that line work is tough—but it's essential, even when conditions are challenging. This month, as we celebrate Lineworker Appreciation Day on April 10, we want to share some interesting facts about electric lineworkers.

Did you know the equipment and tools that a lineworker carries while climbing a utility pole can weigh up to 50 pounds? That's as heavy as 6 gallons of water. And speaking of utility poles, lineworkers can climb poles up to 60 feet tall. They must be committed to their career—because it's not just a job, it's a lifestyle. The long hours and ever-present risks can truly take a toll. The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics lists line work among the 10 most dangerous civilian jobs in the U.S. They often work nontraditional hours outdoors in difficult conditions. The job requires years of training and hands-on learning. That's because working with high-voltage equipment requires specialized technical skills, experience and an ongoing mental toughness. Shortcuts aren't an option, and there is precious little room for error in this line of work.

During severe weather events that bring power outages, lineworkers are among the first ones called. They must be ready to leave the comfort of their homes and families unexpectedly, and they don't return until the job is done, That's why a lineworker's family must also be dedicated to service. Taylor EC lineworkers are responsible for keeping power flowing 24/7, 365 days a year. To do this, they maintain over 5,000 miles of power lines across 11 counties. Being a lineworker may not seem like a glamorous job, but it's essential to the life and well-being of our community. Without the exceptional dedication and commitment of these hardworking men and women, we simply would not have the reliable electricity that we need for everyday life. So, the next time you see a lineworker, please thank them for the work they do to keep power flowing regardless of the conditions. After all, lineworkers are the power behind your power.
